Chicano Latino Youth Leadership (CLYLP) Project Receives \$75K Comcast Foundation Grant

28th Annual CLYLP 'Capitol Day' with the more than 120 CLYLP California Summer Youth

SACRAMENTO, CA—As efforts continue to protect education and youth development programs from severe state budget cuts, the Chicano Latino Youth Leadership Project continues to foster youth leadership skills as it celebrates its 28th annual CLYLP 'Capitol Day'. The organization is able to fulfill its mission due to the commitment of its sponsors. Today at the Capitol Day press conference, Comcast Foundation announced a total investment of \$75,000 over three years to the Chicano Latino Youth Leadership Project (CLYLP) for the CLYLP Comcast Fellowship Program. The CLYLP Summer Youth Capitol Day, also sponsored by Comcast, allowed high-school students to be 'Legislators for the Day' by learning about the legislative process and holding mock hearings on bills currently before the California Legislature. Towards the end of Capitol Day, the students were addressed by California Assembly Speaker John A. Pérez about the importance of civic participation.
