Frequently Asked Questions



- Are 9th and 12th grade students eligible to apply to a CLYLP high school program?

 Students must be in 10th or 11th grade at the time of application for a CLYLP high school program. Students in 9th and 12th grade are NOT eligible to apply.
- My student lives in a county with a regional institute. Can the student apply to both the regional institute and the Statewide Leadership Conference?

YES! If a student lives in a county where a regional institute is offered (BAI, CVI, IEI or LAI) the student is eligible to apply to the Statewide Leadership Conference and/or a regional institute. Students are highly encouraged to apply to both to increase their chances of being accepted into a CLYLP program.

• Can more than one student from my high school apply for a CLYLP program?

YES! Please encourage as many students as possible to apply to programs they are eligible to attend. In Fact, we suggest teachers assign the CLYLP application essay questions as homework or offer extra credit to students that submit an application. The CLYLP application process is designed to prepare students to complete college applications.

• Is there a cost to participate in a CLYLP Program?

All CLYLP programs are **FREE**! CLYLP covers all costs for student participants including housing, meals, and transportation (if applicable).

- Will students be supervised throughout the conference/institute?
 Students will be supervised at all times throughout the conference week/institute weekend by trained CLYLP staff.
- My student requested for me to complete a recommendation for them, how do I submit?
 Each applicant will add your name and email to our online application portal and you will receive a specific email with further details. Please check your spam/junk folders for the email. Additional information can be found on our website: clvlp.org/recommenders
- How does a student submit their transcript to CLYLP?

The student must scan the transcript into a PDF file and upload it to the online application. The transcript does not have to be an official transcript and may be screenshot from an online portal.
